This is the last of our recess reports before both chambers go back into session on September 9th.

### Tracking Congress in the Age of Trump

The lower the number, the more the legislator votes in opposition to the Trump agenda. This is just a reminder of where our MoCs were in April and at the start of August recess,.

This is just a reminder, so we have a baseline for moving into congressional action post-recess.

[08/04/19](#) - Toomey Statement on El Paso and Dayton Shootings: "The mass shootings in El Paso and Dayton are the latest, horrific examples of the violent scourge that is gripping America. The perpetrators of these murders are cowards. We must do more to keep guns out of the hands of psychopaths. While no law will end mass shootings entirely, it's time for Congress to act to help keep our communities safer. We should start by passing bipartisan proposals such as my legislation with Senator Joe Manchin to expand background checks to all commercial firearm sales. I also agree with Senator Lindsey Graham that we should pass a bipartisan "red flag" measure that enables families and law enforcement to obtain a court order to keep guns away from dangerous individuals."
