Tracking Congress in the Age of Trump

Votes of Interest

Disaster Relief for Puerto Rico passes the House

[House Vote](#) on [H.R. 5687](#): Emergency Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief and Puerto Rico Disaster Tax Relief Act

The House passed a disaster recovery bill with aid for Puerto Rico, in the aftermath of their weeks of devastating earthquakes. The \$4.7 billion package includes requirements that the funds are dispersed in a timely fashion, an acknowledgement of the 2+ year long delays that have held up the dispersal of Hurricane Maria aid to the island. President Trump has threatened to veto this bill.

Vote date: Friday, February 7, 2020 **Vote Tally:** 237-161

Party Breakdown: All Democrats voted for this bill. They were joined by 17 Republicans. Independent Justin Amash voted NO, with 160 Republicans.

Union Protections Pass the House

[House Vote](#) on [H.R. 2474](#): Protecting the Right to Organize Act

This is a package of pro-union rules designed to strengthen organized labor protections, even in states that have right-to-work laws. According to the [Library of Congress](#), this bill would:

- prevent employers from classifying employees as exempt from labor law protections
- make it an unfair labor practice to require or coerce employees to attend employer meetings designed to discourage union membership
- permit workers to participate in collective or class action litigation

- expand penalties for labor law violations, including interference with the National Labor Relations Board

According to *Politico*, AFL-CIO President Richard Trumka said his organization would withhold all campaign funding and support from any Democrat who votes against the bill.

Vote date: Thursday, February 6, 2019 **Vote Tally:** 224-194

Party Breakdown: Most Republicans (and the Independent) voted NO, while most Democrats voted YES. But twelve lawmakers broke with their party; 7 Democrats voted NO and 5 Republicans voted YES.

The House disapproves of Trump's shredding of the social safety net

[House Vote](#) on [H.Res. 826](#): Expressing disapproval of the Trump administration's harmful actions towards Medicaid

The text of this resolution includes a comprehensive list of all of the attacks the Trump Administration has made upon the healthcare social safety net, especially Medicaid. It culminates in the statement:

"The Trump administration should uphold its responsibility to faithfully execute the law, including the Medicaid Act, and cease any and all efforts that threaten the care of the millions of Americans who rely on Medicaid."

Because of the way it is built, Democrats can use the NO vote of any lawmaker as a weapon against them and tie that lawmaker to approval of President Trump's attacks on a program that helps the most vulnerable members of our communities.

Vote date: Thursday, February 6, 2020 **Vote Tally:** 223-190

Party Breakdown: Independent Justin Amash and all Republicans voted NO. They were joined by one Democrat, Kurt Schrader of Oregon.

The House GOP tries to censure Pelosi over torn paper

[House Vote](#) on Motion to Table [H.Res. 832](#): Raising a question of the privileges of the House

The GOP introduced a resolution that would censure House Speaker Pelosi for having torn the copy of the President's State of the Union speech. Their reasoning is that the speech itself contained the stories of many notable Americans, and by tearing the paper, she was being disrespectful to those citizens. Democrats moved to table the resolution once it was introduced. A Motion to Table means to dismiss the bill - so a YES vote means that one is opposed to the resolution, with a NO vote means that an MoC supports the goals of the resolution.

Vote date: Thursday, February 6, 2020 **Vote Tally:** 224-193

Party Breakdown: This was a pure, party-line vote. All Democrats and Independent Justin Amash voted YES (to table the resolution) and all Republicans voted NO (to move ahead with the resolution).

The House decides the US Postal Services should be treated the same as other agencies

[House Vote](#) on [H.R. 2382](#): USPS Fairness Act

Most government agencies follow a standard plan for dealing with the cost of retirement benefits for future retirees. The one glaring exception to that has been the US Postal Service. In 2006 the Postal Accountability and Enhancement Act forced the agency to make mandatory set payments toward the health benefits for future retirees. Right after the passage of that measure, the recession hit, and with increasing use of email, postal service decreased considerably. Since then, a number of unsuccessful attempts had been made to remove the demands of the 2006 bill, but they were always lumped in with other provisions, and ultimately failed. This was the first time that the change in retirement funding had been introduced as a standalone measure, which likely accounts for its success.

Vote date: Wednesday, February 5, 2020 **Vote Tally:** 309-106

Party Breakdown: All Democrats voted YES. They were joined by 87 Republicans, about 44% of their caucus. Independent Justin Amash joined the remaining GOP lawmakers in voting NO.

The House protects watersheds and estuaries

[House Vote](#) on [H.R. 4044](#): Protect and Restore America's Estuaries Act

The House considered a package of a half dozen bills to increase protections in a number of watershed environments. Several of those bills passed by voice vote (and you'll find them in the unanimously passed bills section). This measure was the broadest of the legislative packages, designed to improve the water quality and ecological integrity of our Nation's estuaries. In the [words of the bill's sponsor](#), Rep. Tom Malinowski (NJ-07):

It ensures that management plans governing nationally significant estuaries consider the effects of recurring extreme weather events and that they develop and implement appropriate adaptation strategies. It expands eligibility for grants under the program to organizations working to address stormwater runoff, coastal resiliency, and accelerated land loss issues.

Vote date: Wednesday, February 5, 2020 **Vote Tally:** 355-62

Party Breakdown: All Democrats voted YES. They were joined by 132 Republicans, about 66% of the GOP caucus.

The Impeachment Saga Comes to a Close

As the impeachment process and votes have been covered more than adequately over the past months, MoCTrack will simply note that Senator Casey voted to convict the president on both articles; while Senate Toomey voted to acquit the president on both articles. Here is there rationale for those votes, in their own words.

Senator Bob Casey, from [his official website](#):

"Over the course of two weeks, House Managers presented substantial, persuasive evidence that President Trump abused his power and obstructed Congress. It is unfortunate so many of my Republican colleagues voted last week to overrule the will of the American people and block additional witnesses and documents that would speak directly to the President's conduct. America deserved a fair trial and it got a cover-up.

"Even without additional witnesses or documents, after carefully reviewing all of the available evidence, I have determined that House Managers have not only met, but exceeded, any reasonable burden of proof standard. As many Republican Senators now admit, the House Managers proved their case. It is clear: President Trump abused his power and obstructed Congress' investigation.

"There is no doubt that President Trump withheld military aid and a vital White House meeting from Ukraine, in order to coerce its President into announcing a sham investigation of a political rival and a debunked conspiracy theory about the 2016 election. It has also been established that he solicited foreign interference in the 2020 election and then further abused his power by covering it up and obstructing Congress' well-predicated investigation. I will vote guilty on Article I and Article II."

Senator Pat Toomey, from his [official website](#):

"Today, I joined a majority of senators in voting to acquit President Trump. The Constitution sets a very high bar for impeachment and removal of a sitting president. While some of President Trump's actions were inappropriate, they did not come close to meeting the very high bar required to justify overturning the last election, removing him from office, and kicking him off the ballot in an election that has already begun. In November, the American people will decide for themselves whether President Trump should stay in office. In our democratic system, that's the way it should be.

"It is my hope that Congress can now move past this extremely partisan and divisive episode and get back to working on issues that will strengthen our economy and make our communities safer."

Lastly, Senator Casey did an interview about impeachment that was covered in the Bucks County Courier Times. The following quotes were not a part of one long statement, but still convey his feelings about the process. This is excerpted from the article [“Casey on impeachment: Acquittal sends wrong message to president, public”](#):

- “I want to be wrong about this, I want to be dead wrong about this, but it seems with this president, it will encourage him.”
- “I worry at the end of this, he will not read from this a cautionary tale or cautionary note, but a green light.”
- “It’s not as if this is a proceeding without consequences. There are consequences to the country. When a president engages in this kind of conduct, there has to be some kind of response. You can’t allow an executive to use their power unchecked.”
- “At least the country, for the most part, agrees what (Trump) did was wrong. At least the country has a sense that something went wrong.”
- “The overwhelming (GOP) consensus on witnesses and documents sends a message that president can do this and get away with it ... It may send a message to the American citizens that the powerful can do this and get away with it.”
- “But I wouldn’t want to be saying for the rest of my life, I made this decision to acquit without witnesses and documents.”
- “I do think Americans learned a lot about how the power of the president can be used for results that don’t involve their lives... No Americans benefit when (Trump) said words to the effect of, ‘I want you to investigate Joe Biden.’ No one benefits when (Trump) said, ‘I’m not going to make witnesses available.’”
- “One thing from the impeachment trial that will stay with the country for a long while — especially senators — is the question of witnesses and documents,”


